The Construction Safety Campaign (CSC) will be holding its AGM today Saturday 16 November in Birmingham. Formed in 1988 it has campaigned for improvements on health, safety and welfare in the industry forging together many campaigns including the Battersea Crane Disaster Action Group and fighting for the improvement in the appalling fatality and casualty rates infamous in the industry. Retiring National Secretary Tony O'Brien said "The work of the campaign is now more important than ever, while construction fatalities have gone down since the days of slaughter in the 1960's with regular annual death rates of 150 plus, the latest fatality figures for 2012/13 being 39 are a welcome downturn however every death is not only the loss of a loved one but a life changing tragedy for all the family and friends left behind"

The Robert Tressell Awards ceremony will also take place for "Services to Working People". Past recipients of the award have included the late Alan Dalton, asbestos campaigner, The late Simon Pickvance, campaigner on cancer at work and Ark Tribe, Australian Trade Union campaigner who faced jail for standing up for safety on site and threatened with jail.

The meeting will also hear of the sad death in June this year of Reg Johnson, last surviving member of the Robert Noonan (pen name Tressell) family who devoted his life to promoting the book after which the awards are named.

The number of fatal injuries for 2012/2013 is 39, or 1.9 per 100,000 employees. This is a sizable drop from last year's figure of 49 fatalities. The average over the last five years is 53, or 2.3 per 100,000 employees. Out of the 39 fatalities, 12 were workers defined as self-employed.
